Earthquake in Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam Province, Indonesia

Reporting date and time

11 January 2005 (Tuesday) – 16.00 Hrs local time

Type of Emergency

Earthquake followed by tsunami.

Date of emergency incidence

26 December 2004 (Sunday), 07:58 hrs and 08:48 hrs local time. (Indonesia, Western Zone: + 7 GMT), 00:58:50 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)

Casualties

- Death toll is reaching 105,262 and missing are 10,046, with total IDPs are 651,132 (Data from Ministry of Social up to 11 January 2005, 05.00 AM)
- Death toll is reaching 95,000 and the missing are 77,000 (data from Ministry of Health dated 11 January 2005)
- Admission in the hospital as in-patients is 1,201, and out patients are 3,461 (*List is available from MOH.*)
- Number of patients referred to Jakarta is 179
- IDPs estimated reaching to 609,942 people. (*List of number and location is available with the MOH.*)

Follow up activities and information

Ministry of Health

- 213 nurses had been deployed in Banda Aceh and needs on the skilled nurses in ICU/ICCU and operating rooms
- Training for nurses had been conducted in cooperation with foreign medical team
- Needs of psychiatrist and psychologist to IDPs camps especially to eastern part of Aceh
- Meulaboh hospital needs beds
- IDP's camps were scattered and difficult to accessed, it decided to relocate IDPs in 10 camps There are 5 places should be carefully visited especially in Aceh Jaya and Aceh Besar
- Medical and volunteer team from NGO suggested to have direct contact with Military Health center for security reason
- Draft for Standard Operational Procedure for foreign medical staff in NAD Province will be prepared by Directorate of Medical Care Ministry of Health
- Nias Island requests of the bed-nets and medicine since there are 4 sub-districts were difficult to access by health care and the potency of coming typhoon.
- Needs of plastic sheet to evacuate the corpses

WHO Indonesia

Aceh field Operations Centre

- UNDAC team in Aceh reported (09/01/05) that World Health Organization (WHO) and related agencies have started an early warning system for diseases surveillance and outbreak control. Tetanus toxoid and serum for prevention of tetanus has been distributed to hospitals and selected mobile clinics. It is also reported that the development of measles outbreak control plan is in progress. The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has received one confirmed measles case in Banda Aceh. There have been some detected cases of diarrhoea among IDPs, but no evidence of cholera.

International response

- The Government of Japan will deploy a batalyon consist of the medical team and soldiers
- Russian Government are sending medical team and ambulances
- UNICEF had prepared 144 refrigerators and cold chain
