Reporting date and time

12 January 2005 (Wednesday) – 16.00 Hrs local time

Type of Emergency

Earthquake followed by tsunami.

Date of emergency incidence

26 December 2004 (Sunday), 07:58 hrs and 08:48 hrs local time. (Indonesia, Western Zone: + 7 GMT), 00:58:50 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)

Casualties

- The latest information from the Department of Social Affairs (12-01-05 at 04.30 a.m) reported that the number of victims in Aceh and North Sumatra: 113,306 persons and 10,078 persons are missing.
- Death toll is reaching 95,000 and the missing are 77,000 (data from Ministry of Health dated 12 January 2005)
- Admission in the hospital as in patient are 1,411, and out patients are 3689 (*List is available from MOH.*)
- Number of patients referred to Jakarta is 200
- IDPs estimated reaching to 610,333 people. (*List of number and location is available with the MOH.*)

Follow up activities and information

Ministry of Health

Jakarta Operations Centre

- MoH presented the draft of the Work Plan of the MoH for Aceh. It comprises the short term or emergency relief (0 – 3 months) activities, and the medium term (3 months up to 1 year) plan
- The Minister of Health mentioned that MoH should have the list of the foreigners working in health in each district of Aceh
- All humanitarian aid from national or international will be recorded and will be audited by public accountant

WHO Indonesia

- WHO is preparing to set up an office in Banda Aceh for better communication and coordination with Jakarta office
- Sporadic cases of measles has been reported (1 confirmed case in Banda Aceh and 1 case in Meulaboh)
- Cholera has not been reported whereas watery diarrhea is frequent

International Response (report from UN-OCHA)

- Govt Department of Social Affairs has so far identified 1600 separated children and unaccompanied children in the larger IDP settlements in Banda Aceh.
