

# Emergency Situation Report

## Earthquake in Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam Province, Indonesia

15 January 2005, Number 21

### **Reporting date and time**

15 January 2005 (Saturday) – 16.00 Hrs local time

### **Type of Emergency**

Earthquake followed by tsunami.

### **Date of emergency incidence**

26 December 2004 (Sunday), 07:58 hrs and 08:48 hrs local time. (Indonesia, Western Zone: + 7 GMT),  
00:58:50 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)

### **Casualties**

- Death toll is reaching 95,000 and the missing are 77,000 (data from Ministry of Health dated 14 January 2005)
- Admission in the hospital as in-patients is 1,650, and out patients are 6,358 (*include the number of patients admitted in Hospital in Jakarta - List is available from MOH.*)
- IDPs estimated reaching to 610,417 people. (*List of number and location is available with the MOH.*)

### **Follow up activities and information**

#### **Ministry of Health**

- Registered medic, paramedic and non medic personnel in Banda Aceh commander post are 93 specialists, 318 general doctors (GP), 377 nurses, 5 nutritionists, 9 midwives, 2 dental nurses, 2 pharmacists, and 2028 health volunteers
- The coverage of measles vaccination and Vitamin A distribution in Aceh and North Sumatra province in health post up to 13 January 2005, is 2,648 children
- Field hospital of International Red Cross (ICRC) with 100 beds needs 20 doctors and 80 nurses
- The needs of 10 nutritionists (7 male and 3 female) to be based in Zainoel Abidin and Kesdam hospital for replacement of existing personnel.
- The needs of computers, photocopy machine, radio communication and transportation, logistic and operational cost for staff from central level and province level.
- Ministry of Health had develop the Policy and Strategy of Management for Health problem As Result of Earthquake and Tsunami Disaster in NAD and N. Sumatra Province: as Short term (Relief period) 12 months, Mid term (rehabilitation period) 2 years, and Long term (reconstruction period) more than 2 years
- The MoH finished its revised version of the Guideline, Policy and Strategy for disaster management in NAD and North Sumatera Province. The second document on the Action Plan will be finished by Sunday 16 January 2005.

#### **International assistance:**

- ❖ Doctors in Perth – Australia promised to provide hospital care for Aceh victims for free.
- ❖ China will give donations consist of: Wooden houses for the population and for POSKO, acupuncture facilities and some funds from Chinese entrepreneurs.
