## Earthquake in Nanggroe Aceh Darussalam Province, Indonesia

2 January 2005, Number 8

### **Reporting date and time**

2 January 2005 (Sunday) – 14.00 Hrs local time

### **Type of Emergency**

Earthquake followed by tsunami.

### **Date of emergency incidence**

26 December 2004 (Sunday), 07:58 hrs and 08:48 hrs local time. (Indonesia, Western Zone: + 7 GMT),  
00:58:50 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC)

### **Casualties**

#### **Indonesia**

Estimated total (at least): 79,906 killed (according to data from Social Department), 79,667 in Aceh province, and 239 in North Sumatra. Missing are 3,598 (3,595 in Aceh Province and 3 in North Sumatra)

### General Information on Banda Aceh

- from field staff:
  - o 50% of health facilities in 14 affected area are not functioning.
  - o No laboratory in functioning. Need laboratory and laboratory staff

### Impact on Health Service and Health related facilities

- Muhamadiyah and the team of Dr. Aryono (Jakarta) are supporting the re-functioning of the Harapan Bunda Hospital
- Meulaboh Hospital is still functioning (because located on the hill)
- lack of food supplies due to difficulties of ship to get in the harbour
- Sigli Hospital admitted 200 patients with wound infection

### Follow up activities

#### Government

- The regulation of *Bluebook* (passbook to enter Aceh) for foreign journalist had been lifted

#### MOH information

- Indonesia CDC had done the fogging activities in Iskandar Muda Airport and housing area in Banda Aceh remote area
- Health service provided by Mobile Puskesmas (health clinic)
- One ambulance was sent on 31 December
- MoH had deployed 150 doctors and still needs more nurses to be deployed to Banda Aceh.
- MoH requested international organisations to coordinate activities especially in the distribution of medical supplies and provision of health services

#### WHO Indonesia

- WHO and UNICEF staff in Banda Aceh are working together to prepare the warehouse
- WHO conducted a coordination meeting with MOH, NGOs (international and national)
  - o Attendance was more than 40
  - o Sharing of health activities
  - o WHO distributed guidelines and references
  - o Request to agencies to complete matrix for activities and this will be collated by WHO
- Coordination with Singapore Air Force for transportation needs
- Arrival of staff support from WHO offices:
  - o Dr Jean-Michel Tassie
  - o Ms Harsaran Pandey

## UNICEF

- Will be bringing in senior water and sanitation experts to Aceh
- In coordination with immunization unit of CDC, UNICEF plans to have a measles campaign for children of 6 months –15 years old
- 8000 tarpaulins are on the way to Banda Aceh. Distribution will be for 1 tarpaulin per family.

## International Assistance

1. UNFPA will be providing reproductive health kits. Organisations needing them are requested to contact the UNFPA office
2. MSF Belgium is providing medical services in Aceh Jaya District. Thirteen (13) international and 11 national staff have been deployed (doctors, nurses, logistician, water-sanitation expert, psychologist)
3. Save the Children works in Pidie district and they reported that 700 children have been displaced
4. PMI (Indonesian Red Cross) with the support from Red Cross Societies from other countries is planning to build the field hospital in several areas outside of Banda Aceh, and develop/reconstruct damaged hospitals.

## Needs

- Sigli hospital needs injectable antibiotics, ATS, disinfectants, and an ambulance
- Antibiotics (IV), oxygen, masks, gloves, body bags, radio communication sets

## Other information:

- 50% of phone lines are functional
